



## Washington State Skeet Association Yearly Recognition



### WSSA High Average Teams

1. Must shoot the state shoot.
2. Must shoot state minimums (500-12, 400 – 20, 28 and 410)
3. 850 of the minimums must be shot in state.
4. Position on teams by 4-gun average:
  - a. All-State skeet team (Top 5 highest averages)
  - b. Second Team (Next 5 highest averages 6-10)
  - c. Honorable Mention (Highest averages 11-15)

### All-Star Team

1. Must shoot the state shoot
2. Must shoot state minimums (500-12, 400 – 20, 28 and 410)
3. 850 of the minimums must be shot in state.
4. Captain – Winner of HOA at the American state shoot
5. Most Improved – based on 4-gun averages previous year over year being honored.
6. Classes – AA-E – based on 12 gage class at the beginning of the year being honored.
7. Lady – 500 12 gauge – highest average with 250 being shot in state.
8. Rookie-Of-The-Year – based on 500 targets any combination. First time shooter.
9. Junior and Sub-Junior – 500 any combination
10. International – Winner of the state international state championships.

### Appreciation Award

Awarded to a person, group or club that works hard for skeet in Washington State over a period of Time.

### Hall of Fame

Individuals inducted are top shooters or long term supported of skeet in Washington State for a minimum of 12 years.

### Washington State Skeet Scholarship

Awarded to an individual(s) that have completed at least one quarter of college/trade school and meet the qualifications as put forth. Qualifications/Criteria available from any WSSA officer/club representative.

### When Awarded

The above awards are awarded at the annual state shoot. Teams are based on the past years shooting. Other awards as eligible participants are selected.
