Selection Process

1. Scholarship applications may be obtained anytime from and must be submitted to:

Applications must be submitted by August 15th for consideration at the following September board/scheduling meeting of the Washington Skeet Shooters Association. However, applications can be submitted any time the applicant wishes to do so.

2. Applications can be submitted by the individual, parents, relatives, guardians or members of the Washington Skeet Shooters Association.
3. Qualified recipients will be selected at the annual WSSA board/scheduling meeting by the board of directors. If there are no qualified individuals or applications pending, the fund will continue to grow.
 - (a) Each club represented at a meeting when a scholarship recipient is selected will have one vote for selection regardless of the number of representatives allowed. Voting club representatives cannot be relatives of individuals being considered for a scholarship. In such cases an alternate must be the voting club representative.
 - (b) Discussion regarding recipients may be in open forum but all voting will be by secret ballot.
4. Scholarship will be released by WSSSF and paid directly to the college or trade school for use by the recipient after completion of one semester, trimester or quarter of higher education as long as they have maintained a 3.0 grade point in high school and have a minimum of a “C” average their first semester, trimester or quarter of college or trade school.
5. Individuals not selected may be considered an unlimited number of times. It is suggested that a new application be submitted each time in light of the fast changing accomplishments of youth.
6. If applicant is a shooter, their skeet shooting record will not be part of the selection process.
7. The scholarship will be awarded at the state shoot following selection. The recipient will be asked to say a few words on what skeet and the scholarship means to them. If they are not present, their sponsor will be asked to read a brief statement from the recipient.
8. Any scholarship not used by the recipient five (5) years after award of the scholarship shall become null and void.
